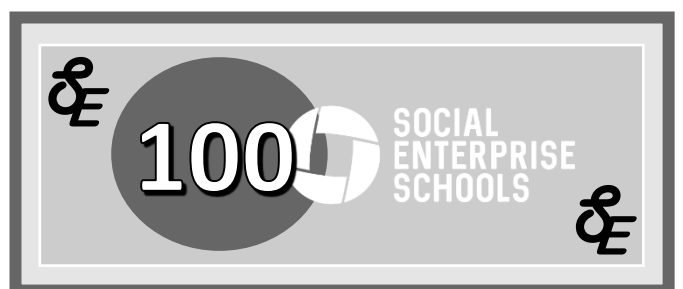
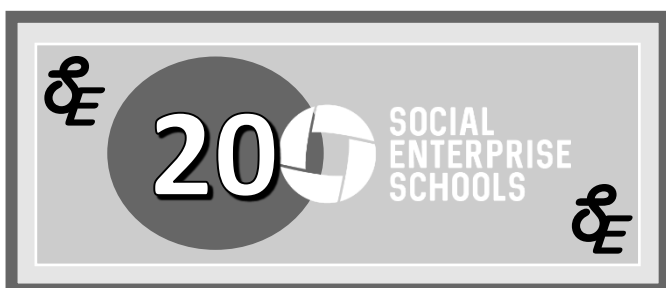
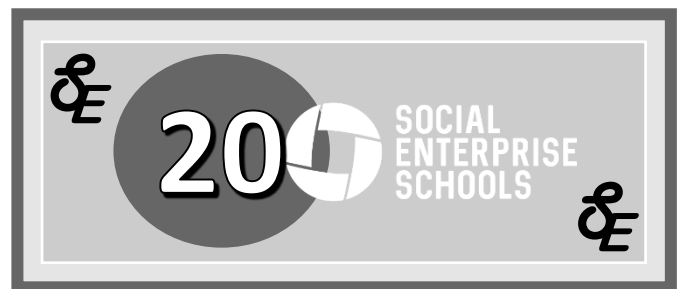
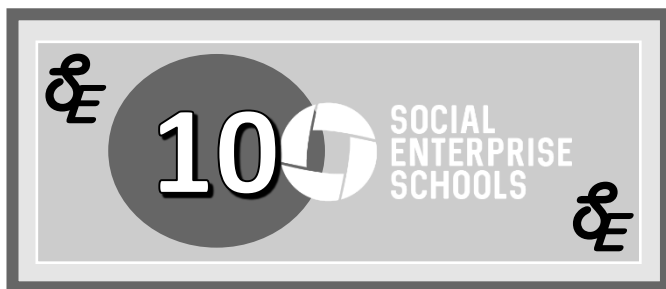
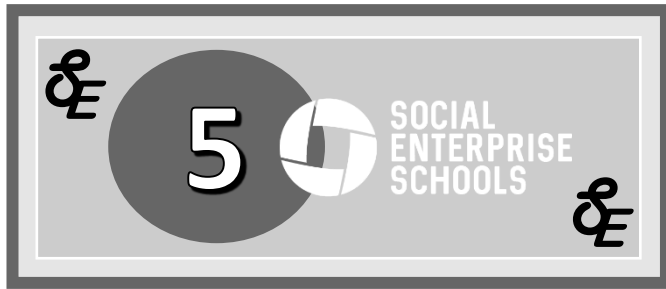


SKILLS AUCTION INSTRUCTIONS

Give each group a copy of the skills auction sheet and a department placemat. Ask them to decide which of the skills are most important to their departments and how much they are willing to bid for them.

Each group has a total of 500 SE's to bid with. The bidding for each skill begins at 10 and the auctioneer can increase bids in units of 5. If a group wishes to bid for a 'skill', one group member must raise their arm to indicate a bid. When all 'skills' have been purchased, these should be placed on their department sheet and the class then tour each department, primarily with the aim of thinking about which department suits their own skills. Record any highly fought after skills on the board to highlight those that are most popular.

NOTE: Print out 2 copies of this sheet per group to equal 500 SE notes.
