LEARNING PROGRAMME

The Glenkens has been selected as one of only five rural communities across Scotland to undertake a learning programme focusing on land use.

The sessions will explore the reasons and processes behind land use change, identify sustainable land-based priorities & opportunities for local people, and give voice to the communities' needs and wishes through developing a shared vision for future land use.

This learning programme is for everyone – participants, partners and Scottish Government. The overall purpose of the programme is to support and strengthen community inclusion in decision making about how local land is used.

WHY GET INVOLVED?

The Government is committed to addressing the twin climate and nature emergencies, and states that land use will be critical to meeting its ambitious targets for 2030 and 2045.

It is driving towards a step change that invests in the future and delivers public interest in land use. Key elements of this include economic recovery & renewal, Scotland's land use strategy and rights & responsibilities statement, post-CAP rural support, planning reform and landscape-scale collaboration.

This is an opportunity for people living & working in the Glenkens area to come together and agree a land use vision which builds on work undertaken to date and complements the Glenkens & District Community Action Plan and the Carsphairn Futures Plan. Participants will identify and discuss how to overcome challenges to delivering this vision, and present this to the Regional Land Use Partnership stakeholders and Scottish Government policy makers at the end of the programme.
